Create-a-Creature

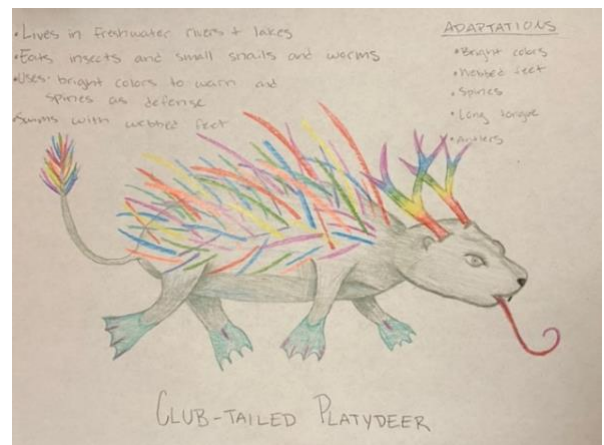

3. Name your creature.
