Be a Bee!

Flowers attract pollinators, like bees, with bright colors and yummy-smelling scents. When bees visit a flower, pollen sticks to their fuzzy bodies and is transferred from flower to flower. In this activity, little ones will practice their fine motor skills while pretending to be a bee and moving pollen between the flowers.

You'll need:

- Paper flower template
- Scissors
- Crayons or colored pencils
- Tongs or tweezers
- Pom poms or other small items for "pollen"

What to do:

1. Print the flower template and color the flowers, or draw your own flowers.
2. Cut the flowers out and place them around the room. Put 2 to 3 pom poms on each flower.
3. Pretend to be a bee and use the tongs or tweezers to move the "pollen" (pom poms) from one flower to another.
