Weather Chart Craft

The weather changes often. With this activity, little ones can observe the weather occurring where they are and track it daily.

You'll need:

- Paper plate
- Glue or tape
- Crayons or colored pencils
- Clothespin or paperclip
- Weather symbols (sun, snow, umbrella/rain)
- Scissors
- Optional: Hole punch, yarn
- Optional: cotton balls



What to do:

1. Cut out the weather symbols and glue them on a paper plate. If you don't have the template, draw the different symbols (sun, clouds, rain, etc.). Cotton balls can be used for the clouds.
2. Glue an arrow on a clothespin or paperclip.
3. Use a hole punch or scissors to punch a hole in the paper plate, near the edge.
4. Use a piece of yarn to make a loop and hang the weather chart near a window.
5. Look outside each morning (or anytime really) and mark the weather with the arrow.
6. Optional: record your observations daily to see what the weather is like over the course of a week or month. How has the weather changed?
